Board of Health Meeting Minutes
December 18, 2025

President Dr. Valerie Moore called the December 18, 2025, Clark County Combined Health District Board of Health meeting to order at 6:01 pm.

Board members present: Dr. Sherry Robinette, Dala DeWitt, Scott Griffith, Dr. Valerie Moore and Mike Adamson.

Board members, Dr. Bernadette deGuzman and Jessie Johnson, were absent.

Mr. Adamson motioned to adopt the December 18, 2025, agenda and Mr. Griffith seconded. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Ms. DeWitt motioned to accept the November 20, 2025, meeting minutes, and Dr. Robinette seconded. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Old Business

Sewage Variance-170 Davis Avenue: Zibby reminded the board of this previously tabled variance request that would allow for a component of the septic system to be installed closer than 10 feet to the property line, the dwelling, and utility lines. She said that the hold harmless is contingent upon the homeowner signing a hold harmless agreement. She said that a site visit was conducted to assess the feasibility of implementing a soil-based sewage treatment system, however, upon inspection it was determined that suitable areas for such a system could not be found due to the presence of buried gas and water lines in the front yard, a buried pool with fill material in the backyard, compacted unsuitable soil from a recently removed tree and insufficient space for a suitable absorption trench. The installer proposed an alternative solution which involves the installation of a discharging system with a trench running along the side of the property with some questions due to the presence of the gas line, which may require the installation to be rerouted. She said that this variance would allow for the installation of the septic system in a location that is closer than the standard 10 feet distance from the property line and utility lines which may pose potential risks, including the proximity to the gas line, which could compromise safety and conflicts with utility companies. She said that the variance would cover both options and we would rely on the installer to make the best decision thinking about the utility line.

New Business

Sewage Variance – 60 Skyline Drive: Zibby explained that this variance request is for the installation of a septic system that involves relocating the leach lines closer than the standard 10-foot distance from the property's driveway. She said that the current septic system design was conducted prior to the commencement of construction, however, during the installation process it became apparent that the driveway had moved or expanded, resulting in the discrepancy between the original design and the actual site conditions. She said that due to the limitations and the presence of bedrock, it is not feasible to accommodate the 10-foot distance and recommend the property owner install a barrier or cubed area at the edge of the driveway over the leach lines to keep a car from diving over it, which could cause damage to the system.

Sewage Nuisances – 609 Geron Drive and 210 Meadow Lane: Zibby said that the properties at 609 Geron Drive and 210 Meadow Lane have been identified as having defective aerator discharging systems. An initial inspection conducted in October and November, respectively, revealed that both systems lacked functioning motors. She said that the property owners advised that a service provider has been contacted to address the issue, however, the lack of a motor constitutes a significant public health concern, and we are requesting the board declare both public health nuisances.

Class II Composting Facility & C&DD License Renewals: Zibby said that both the Paygro and Northeast Landfill Clark County LLC are seeking approval for their 2026 licenses. The Northeast Landfill is a construction and demolition debris landfill that is currently not open but has applied for its license to be ready for potential reopening. She said that both facilities provide significant value to the community. She said that the Springfield Landfill, which was approved last year with conditions, has made significant progress in addressing the concerns raised, however, the submitted paperwork requires further review and stability studies, which the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is currently working on. She said that we are asking the board table the approval of the license until the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) provides technical guidance. She said that the Springfield Landfill will still be permitted to continue operating under its existing license, and we will bring the matter back to the board once the necessary paperwork is completed.

2026 Water Pollution Control Loan Fund Grant Submission: Zibby said that the Water Pollution Control Loan Fund (WPCLF) grant program provides funding assistance to homeowners who need repairing or replacing their failing septic systems. She said that our agency has a long-standing history of receiving grant funding through this program, dating back to 2017, and has successfully utilized these funds to support the repair and replacement of approximately 81 septic systems, totaling approximately \$1.5 million in funding. She said that we are extremely grateful for the opportunity to apply for this grant funding as it has a profoundly positive impact on the community.

Employee Service Recognition & Appreciation Policy: Chris said that as we continue to grow and evolve as an organization, it is essential that we recognize and appreciate the dedication and hard work of our employees and to that end we have revised our employee service recognition and appreciation policy to better reflect our commitment to our workforce. He noted that the policy was established in 2017 and has

remained unchanged for an extended period, so the workforce development team took the opportunity to review and update the policy. He said that the revision introduces a new approach aimed at demonstrating our appreciation for our employees’ commitment and service. He said that the appreciation items include a public health lanyard or badge reel, credit towards the logo store, additional personal leave, wellness breaks and casual days in a tiered recognition system, with new levels available for employees who have reached milestones such as 5, 10, 15 and 20 years of service. He said that the policy will be implemented immediately, and all employees will be provided with information on how to access the recognition program. He added that the policy will be regularly reviewed to ensure it remains effective and aligned with organizational objectives.

Cybersecurity Incident Reporting Policy: Chris said that as we continue to navigate the increasing threat landscape, it has become evident that municipalities across the state are falling victim to various cyberattacks, including malware and ransomware. In response to this growing concern, HB96 has been enacted to impose certain requirements on local municipalities, including our independent subdivision and in alignment with the revised code we are required to adopt a comprehensive cybersecurity incident reporting policy. He referred to the policy included in the packet and said that it outlines the necessary steps and response protocols for reporting and managing cybersecurity incidents. This policy is a crucial component of our cybersecurity posture and serves as a foundation for more extensive requirements that will be implemented in phase 2. He acknowledged and thanked Tech Advisors for their support and guidance. He said that their expertise has been instrumental in developing the initial phase of this policy, and we are currently working with them to refine and finalize the more comprehensive phase 2 requirements, which are scheduled for adoption by mid-next year.

Strategic Plan 2026-2028: Chris said that it is with great satisfaction that we present our updated Strategic Plan, spanning the period of 2026 to 2028. Our last Strategic Plan, which covered the years 2018 to 2020, was superseded by unforeseen global events that required our immediate attention; however, we are now poised to embark on a new chapter, one that prioritizes both internal and external focus areas. He acknowledged and thanked the invaluable contributions of numerous stakeholders, including employees, community partners, and external organizations, whose input and feedback were instrumental in shaping the document. He said that we reaffirm our commitment to our core mission, vision and values which serve as the foundation for our strategic objectives. Our strategic plan is organized around 2 primary focus areas: internal and external and the following outline provides an overview of our approach: internal focus areas include workforce development and improving workforce retention rates through targeted initiatives (pages 11-14), culture by enhancing collaboration, communication, transparency, and performance management systems (pages 15-17) and sustainability by assessing and ensuring long-term financial health, while ensuring a smooth transition to a new Health Commissioner (pages 18-20). External focus areas include community connections by modernizing community relations, expanding authentic community engagement, and enhancing access to services (pages 21-24) and expansion and access by evaluating and optimizing our agency based on community needs (pages 25-28). He said that our approach is centered on a collaborative, employee-centric, and community-focused framework. He said that we recognize the importance of engaging with stakeholders, including employees, community partners, and external organizations to inform our strategic objectives. He said that as part of our next steps we will be sharing this document with the entire staff and will engage in open discussions to ensure its successful implementation.

Union County Plumbing Inspection Services Contract: Chris said that we have completed our first year of utilizing Union County services for our plumbing inspection operations and looking back, we had anticipated some challenges, but the transition has far exceeded our initial expectations. He said that our environmental health team led by Zibby has consistently demonstrated a high level of professionalism and adaptability throughout this process. He said that despite the significant change for our agency, there were no major disruptions or complaints from our staff, the public, or our plumbing services. He said that given the positive experience, we have decided to continue our partnership with Union County for next year. He said that our primary focus is on ensuring that our customers receive the highest level of service, and we are confident that this partnership aligns with those goals. He said that during the 2026 calendar year we will conduct a mid-year review to assess the effectiveness of this partnership and identify areas for improvement which will enable us to refine our processes and make any necessary adjustments to maintain the highest level of service for our customers. Dr. Moore asked how the inspections are completed with Union County. Zibby explained that the plumbing inspector lives in Clark County and parks his truck here and starts his day in Clark County. She added that he has been busy enough that he spends a majority of his day here in Clark County.

Motorcycle Ohio Grant Submission: Gracie said that the Motorcycle Ohio grant is an annual program through the Ohio Department of Public Safety providing funding in the amount of \$42,000.00 which supports staff time for administration and organization as well as contractually arranged instructors. Dr. Moore asked how many instructors there are, and Gracie advised that she does not have the exact number but believes it to be between 10 and 15. She said that each instructor rotates through 22 classes we offer during the season which spans from May to September. Dr. Robinette asked if these classes are separate from the BMV-issued motorcycle licenses, and Gracie confirms that is correct. She explained that upon completing the class, which includes both theoretical and practical components individuals receive an endorsement, allowing them to directly apply for a motorcycle license at the BMV.

Transfers and Advances: Jeff explained that we are asking for approval of 4 unbudgeted transfers including \$89,500.00 to MEICHV, \$20,000.00 to Safe Communities and \$4,500.00 to the Preconception Health fund. Monthly Fund Report: Jeff shared the monthly fund report. He said that a review of our year-to-date revenue reveals a decrease of approximately \$1.5 million compared to our budget and notably, a significant portion of this downturn can be attributed to events that occurred in March of this year. He said on the other hand, our year-to-date expenses have decreased by about \$3.7 million and emphasized that this decline is a direct result of the difficult decisions made in March. He highlighted the positive impact of certain strategic initiatives including the mid-year 8212 fund for which underwent significant changes in their billing model which resulted in an increase from approximately \$100,000.00 to almost \$550,000.00 which is testament to the team's hard work and dedication. He thanked Chris, Gracie, and

everyone involved in this project, adding that their commitment to finding solutions has positioned us well for the future.

2025 Amended Budget Approval: Jeff explained that the budget is a comprehensive document outlining our projected income and expenses for the year. He said as the year progresses, we continually assess and refine the budget to ensure it remains aligned with our actual financial performance. He said that we are asking the board to approve the final amended budget for 2025, as presented.

2026 Initial Budget Approval: Chris started by explaining the format for the budget which was introduced last year and asked Gracie and Jeff to add additional highlights he misses. He reviewed the budget and explained that there are summaries depending on the level of detail desired that were included in the original email which contained about 40 pages. He said that the budget document contains every fund including salaries, Medicare, dental, insurance, supplies, leases, and other relevant information and highlighted a couple of summary pages that are new this year and include an overall revenue and expense report. He shared that the projected bottom-line revenue for next year is approximately \$9.6 million, which excludes transfers and advances as that is the most accurate way to represent our true revenues and expenses. Advances are essentially loans to funds for cash flow purposes, which are then repaid and transfers are simply moves from one fund to another to support programs that receive levy dollars. He said that if we were to include transfers and advances, the projected revenue would be approximately \$11.6 million, however, it reiterated that the true revenue is only around \$9.6 million. He said that we are currently facing a situation where it appears that we will be spending more than we are taking in but we have balances to work with and have some grant funds that have been utilized and should have been. He added that some of our deliverable grants have not been completed, and we are working to rectify that. He said that there are funds where we have not been able to follow best accounting practices, and we are taking steps to address that. He noted that we will be implementing a spend down on many of these funds which will be visible in the budget. This highlights the need for additional revenue streams, such as property taxes, which generate over \$2 million annually and he noted that we will continue to work on reducing expenses while looking for new revenue streams. He said that one of the main take a ways from the budget is the need to implement a cost-of-living adjustment for our staff which will be factored into our staffing levels. He said that we will be implementing a health insurance increase, as our renewal period is July 1st. He said this budget is part of strategic plan, which requires longer-term projections, such as 5- and 10-year forecasts and that he, Gracie and Jeff are working on developing a more complex but simple approach to producing these projections. He said that our goal is to set ourselves up for success while meeting the needs of the community within the given budget constraints. He reviewed classifications for carryover dollars, including restricted, committed, assigned and unassigned funds and shared that our estimated leave liability for 2027 is around \$65,000.00.

Environmental Health: Zibby said that Rita Lewis is set to retire from her position as Environmental Health Support Clerk on Tuesday, December 23rd, after a span of 37 years of combined dedicated service. She said that Rita has had previous stints with the health department, returning to the agency multiple times before her most recent retirement in 2022. She said that Rita cultivated strong connections with various stakeholders, including customers and external parties, resulting in a profound impact to the agency and community. She thanked Rita for her dedicated service and wished her well in her retirement. Additionally, she thanked the entire environmental health team for their unwavering support and dedication. She said that they have faced numerous challenges recently, including environmental and operational pressures, which necessitated significant adjustments.

Nursing and Clinics: Cheyenne expressed gratitude to the entire nursing team for their tireless efforts and dedication to the community. She said that as we approach the end of 2025 she is reminded of the numerous challenges and changes they faced as a profession, particularly in the nursing and public health sectors. She said that she is impressed by the staff's resilience and commitment to delivering exceptional services and she is grateful for their continued commitment to the agency and community.

Early Childhood: Lori acknowledged the outstanding efforts of the home visitors and said that their dedication to providing exceptional experiences for their clients is truly commendable. She noted that their waitlist has decreased to 26, marking a significant improvement from previous periods, which is a positive indicator of their service effectiveness. She said that they have encountered an issue with the cribs for the Cribs for Kids program with the cribs being held up in customs, affecting distribution in 6 counties in Ohio, where we have a presence. She said that they are working closely with the hospital to explore alternative solutions, such as reallocating our existing units or requesting additional units from the manufacturer. Lastly, she acknowledged the fundraiser organized by the Edward Jones office of Sarah Clemens, which raised significant donations for Help Me Grow families. She said that this collaboration has been noteworthy and appreciated by our home visitors and the families we serve.

Women, Infants & Children: Emily started by thanking the WIC team for their tireless efforts and commitment to the agency and participants they serve. She acknowledged their hard work, particularly with the new weekly walk-in clinics, which has been challenging but a crucial aspect of their operation. She thanked the entire team for their willingness to adjust and refine the processes to better serve the participants. She highlighted a change to the monthly reporting guidelines regarding minimally breastfed infants which reflected a shift in the October and November reports. She said that Abby Stambaugh who joined us last week has been invaluable in her transition to WIC Support Clerk. Her enthusiasm and willingness to learn has been a welcome addition to the team and she is excited to watch her continue to grow in her position. She said that the maintenance team has been working diligently to revitalize their

clinic's aesthetic. Over the past week, they have successfully painted various rooms including the lobby, clinic and waiting rooms and the result is a brighter and more inviting atmosphere for their participants.

Health Planning: Gracie thanked Helaina LeCaptain, whose last day was on the 12th for her dedication and expertise in the field of epidemiology. She said that Anna Jean Sauter will facilitate the hiring process for a new epidemiologist and thanked her for ensuring a smooth transition. She thanked Jacob Clark, our new Health Planning supervisor and the entire Health Planning team, adding that the reorganization of programs has presented new opportunities for growth and development and she is grateful for the team's enthusiasm and adaptability. She highlighted a recent development that was made possible through a generous donation from the Ohio Department of Health. In late September, our drug overdose coordinator, Jacob, was approached by the Ohio Department of Health to consider acquiring an additional Narcan vending machine. We were pleased to accept this offer and work with the Salvation Army to secure a partnership for the placement of the machine at their facility. She said that through this partnership, we have created an additional access point for Narcan in the community, which has contributed to the decline in overdose fatalities. She said that we are committed to continued education and stigma reduction efforts to promote the use of Narcan and address the broader issue of substance abuse. Dr. Robinette asked about placement of the Narcan vending machine and accessibility. Gracie said that the machine is monitored and secured to prevent unauthorized access by children. Mr. Griffith added that the machine is only accessible during operating hours and staff from the Salvation Army are present to oversee it. He said that while there is still some risk of accidental access, there are measures in place to mitigate it.

No Special Report

Legislative Update & Health Commissioner's Comments: Chris said that the Ohio General Assembly introduced HB609 that would require public bodies, such as health departments and boards of health, to allow for public comments before taking any action. This bill aims to increase transparency and community engagement in the decision-making process. While it is not clear yet how this bill will be implemented, he encouraged everyone to familiarize themselves with the details and provide feedback during the public comment period. He said that HB587 and SB299 are exploring the regulation of kratom, a tropical based substance that has been found in opioid-like properties. He said that kratom is currently unregulated in the United States, so Ohio is taking steps to regulate its sale, production and distribution. He said that as we move into the new year, we will be focusing on the 2026 budget and exploring ways to reduce expenses and increase revenue with one potential area of impact being the Rural Health Transformation Program, which is a \$50 billion investment by Congress to strengthen healthcare access in rural America. Ohio has applied for funding which aims to improve access to healthcare services, increase the rural healthcare workforce pipeline, and enhance technology services for emergency medical services. He said that Ohio's application for funding includes seven focus areas which are increasing access to healthcare services, particularly in rural areas, developing a rural health care workforce pipeline through partnerships with education institutions, improving technology services for emergency medical services, enhancing community paramedicine and EMS interactions, focusing on chronic disease prevention and promoting healthy behaviors, establishing school-based health centers and vision care centers and reducing infant mortality rates through the Ohio SEED program. He said that we have been exploring the Care Portal initiative, a national care-sharing technology platform that allows entities to submit needs and have them fulfilled by other organizations. He said that this is a partnership with local churches and businesses to provide wraparound services for families and children in our

community and while there is a one-time fee associated with the platform, we believe the potential benefits outweigh the costs. He said that as part of ongoing safety and awareness efforts, we asked staff members to create educational safety videos on various topics including suspicious packages, fires, and earthquakes. He said that the videos were well-received, staff had a lot of fun making them and they will be used to train new staff members in the coming months. He said that 2026 is going to be filled with some changes at the leadership level but that he has complete confidence in this transition and thanked the board for their understanding of this need and added that he is excited to see where Gracie is going to take the health department. He advised that Mr. Adamson was reappointed by the City of Springfield for another term with the Board of Health and thanked him for continuing to serve. Dr. Moore said that she does not remember seeing Haitian and Hispanic births on the vital statistics report and asked when this was added. Shannon advised that we began receiving several requests for this information around March and felt that it was a good addition to the monthly report.

We are requesting \$2,500.00 in funding from the United Way Springfield Unity Fund to support patients who have extraordinary social service needs following complex medical events during which they were intensively case-managed by the Clark County Combined Health District.

Background

The Clark County Combined Health District is responsible for isolation and treatment of patients with illnesses of significant public health impact. Treatment and case management of patients can last for weeks or even months. During this time patients may lose employment, housing, and other basic social determinants of health. The Health District works to re-connect patients to their community but often our Haitian patients have a single significant barrier, often financial, to re-integrating into their old life. While the Health District can connect people to resources, we have no funding available to help Haitian patients with single financial barriers that will allow them to get back to work and providing for their families.

Intervention, Budget, and Timeline

During case management and treatment, the Clark County Combined Health District supports all basic humanitarian needs of an isolated patient. Following release from isolation, patients occasionally need basic needs met while they re-integrate into work and the community. For example, if someone loses a job while in isolation, they may need one-month's rent paid while they secure new employment. The Health District has no funding for this "bridge" to re-integration. We currently have several Haitian patients with some significant needs and a grant award from the United Way Unity Fund would be critical as a bridge to self-sufficiency. The requested funds of \$2,500 would be responsibly spent on identified social needs immediately.

PURPOSE

- Pursuant to Section 145.01 of the Ohio Revised Code and Ohio Administrative Code 145-1-26, the Clark County Combined Health District (CCCHD) is executing a plan for the conversion of sick leave and vacation leave to cash for leave that is accrued, but not used, during the calendar year, as defined as January 1 to December 31, as part of an annual conversion plan. These earnings are earnable salaries on which employee and employer contributions shall be remitted to OPERS. Leave conversion will take place during January for leave earned the previous calendar year.

POLICY & PROCEDURE

- Leave shall be converted on a last in, first out (LIFO) basis. The leave to be considered earnable salary is the leave accrued to date in the current calendar year, less any leave used to date in the same calendar year. For retiring employees, conversion payment must occur according to the plan and either prior to or during the month of their termination date for this earnable salary to be included in the calculation of Final Average Salary.
- The following payments made to employees shall not have retirement contributions withheld as they will not meet the definition of earnable salary for OPERS purposes:
 - Leave more than the annual amount of leave accrued January 1 to December 31 less leave used January 1 to time of payment
 - Leave earned in previous calendar years (other than payments made in January for leave accrued but not used during the previous calendar year)
 - Conversion of leave to employees separating employment
 - Conversion of leave to retiring employees outside the regular payment schedule
- Employees may receive conversion payments in January of each year for converted leave. Leave may be converted according to the following schedule:
 - Sick leave- Up to 48 hours of sick leave if they used less than 48 hours during the previous calendar year (annual fulltime accumulation is 120 hours) and have a sick leave balance of at least 300 hours accrued while employed at the CCCHD.
 - Vacation leave- Up to 40 hours of vacation leave if they have a balance of at least 160 hours and have earned the leave to be converted during the previous year.
- Leave Accrual
 - Sick leave is accrued at 4.62 hours per pay period for a forty hour per week employee.
 - Vacation leave is accrued per pay period based on the accrual schedule in the Personnel Policy Manual.

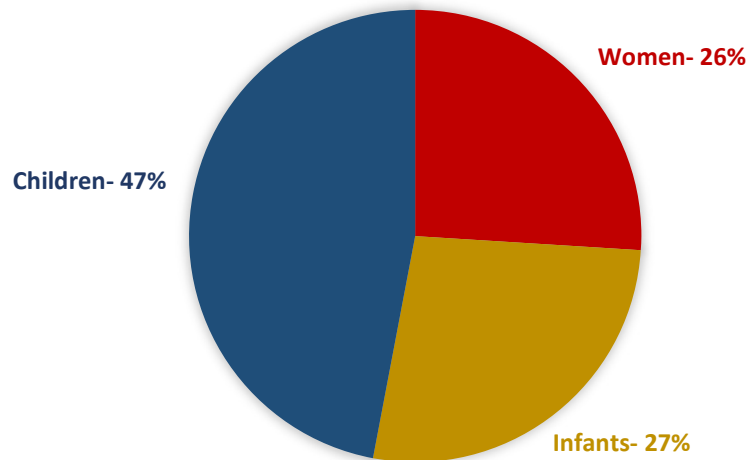

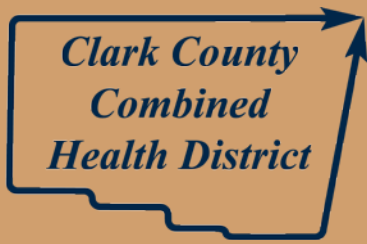

Drug Overdose Prevention*

- **One2One**
 - Second Harvest Food Bank (SHFB) Partnership: over the month of December, we provided food to 324 clients.
 - Sheltered Inc. Partnership: over the month of December, we completed 0 housing referrals.
 - Department of Job and Family Services Clark County Partnership: over the month of December, we assisted 1 client in completing applications for Medicaid and SNAP benefits.
 - Harm Reduction Program from December 2025 (this data is always 1 month behind):
 - Client Visits: 213
 - Syringes Exchanged: 10,007
 - Narcan Kits Distributed: 17*
 - Treatment Referrals: 2

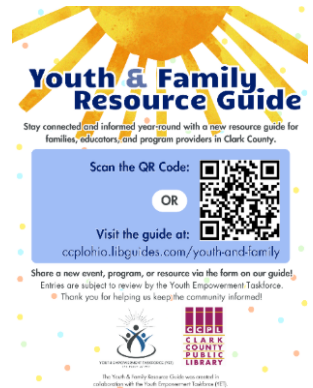
*Number is low due to directing clients to access Narcan kits via naloxone box that is outside of the Southern Village office location.

- **Substance Abuse/DOP**
 - Zarine Giardullo has officially stepped into the grant coordinator for the overdose prevention grant.
 - Wellness kit supplies for navigators in Montgomery and Butler County were distributed. Kits will be used to engage individuals to access services.
 - Program staff is working with state partners to go over goals and policies of Overdose and Suicide Fatality Reviews.

Adolescent Health

- The program has continued to develop relationships with youth serving organizations and other community stakeholders to serve on the grant's advisory committee.

- Program staff have a youth resiliency training scheduled at United Senior Services for March.
- Youth empowerment taskforce is planning to distribute an additional questionnaire to Clark County healthcare providers. This questionnaire will assess whether YET has helped close the gap in youth mental health care awareness within our community.



Safe Communities

- The next Safe Communities Coalition will be held on January 15, 2026, and this meeting will include a fatal review conducted by Lt. Cook from the Ohio State Highway Patrol.
- Program Staff are in the process of scheduling and planning the annual seatbelt check that will include all school districts in the county.

Motorcycle Ohio

- Students can begin signing up for classes beginning on January 26, 2026.
- The grant application for FY27 was completed and submitted to the state on January 8th.

Tobacco

- Program staff collaborated with the Pregnancy Resource Center to provide training about the referral portal so they can refer patients as needed.
- Staff attended a meeting with newly appointed Springfield City Commissioners to discuss enhancements of the current tobacco retailer license.
- Program staff is scheduling training with Deputy Loney and Tecumseh HS students to advocate for a district wide vape disposal policy.
- Program staff working with Mercy Health Lung Care Center to partner on tobacco related community outreach activities.

Creating Healthy Communities

- CHC continues to be an active member of several local coalitions and taskforces, such as the Clark County Local Foods Council and the Chronic Disease Taskforce.
- Program staff attended the Human Services Transportation Coalition meeting on January 7th to learn about current transportation initiatives occurring within the county and how it can align with their initiatives.

Q4 SUMMARY:

During the 4th quarter of 2025, a total of 418 deaths were recorded, slightly lower than 426 deaths in Q4 2024. Heart disease remained the leading cause of death (93), followed by cancer (60), chronic respiratory disease (40), cerebrovascular disease (37), and Alzheimer's disease (27). Deaths related to hypertension (43) were notably higher compared to the same period in 2024. Overall mortality patterns in Q4 2025 were consistent with the prior year.
