Clark County Combined Health District
Board of Health Meeting Minutes
July 17, 2025

Dr. Moore called the July 17, 2025, Clark County Combined Health District Board of Health meeting to order at 6:01 pm.

Board members present: Dr. Sherry Robinette, Dala DeWitt, Dr. Valerie Moore, Mike Adamson and Scott Griffith.

Board members absent: Dr. Bernadette deGuzman.

Staff present: Chris Cook, Health Commissioner; Gracie Hemphill, Deputy Health Commissioner; Elizabeth “Zibby” DeWitt, Environmental Health Director; Lori Lambert, Early Childhood Director; Cheyenne Taylor, Director of Nursing; Shannon Hackathorne, Administration & HR Supervisor; Jeff Hoerner, Director of Finance and Kim Wise, Public Health Specialist.

Guests: James Coors, Cheryl Arwood, Lanette Battigaglia, and Steve Bowling.

Ms. DeWitt motioned to adopt the July 17, 2025, agenda and Dr. deGuzman seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Mr. Griffith motioned to accept the June 18, 2025, meeting minutes, and Mr. Adamson seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

No Public Comment

Old Business

Springfield Landfill: Zibby said that since the last meeting they have conducted a meeting with the Springfield Landfill representatives, including the owner and their consultant, to discuss our plans for their licensing and following this meeting, we have engaged in further discussions with the owner and their consultant, who have provided us with the updated information. She said that we have received a draft copy of the topographic map, which is included in the board packet. She said that she and Chris also conducted a technical meeting with the Ohio EPA to address our concerns regarding the landfill’s compliance with regulatory requirements, specifically the issue of overfill. The primary concern is the location and extent of the overfill, which may be impacting surrounding properties. She said that the owner and their consultant have been responsive and cooperative in addressing our concerns and we are working closely with the Ohio EPA to obtain the necessary documentation and to explore conditions that can be placed on their license to address any outstanding issues. She noted that they did identify additional areas that require further investigation after their conversation with the Ohio EPA, including a survey of the overfill to determine if it is encroaching on adjacent properties so they will be requesting that the Ohio EPA conduct this survey and provide a report to us. She said that considering this information, she would request this item be tabled until the next regular meeting to allow them sufficient time to review the additional information and ensure that we are in compliance with all regulatory requirements.

Solid Waste Nuisance – 9410 Milton Carlisle Road: Zibby said that this property was previously declared a public health nuisance and as part of the resolution the property owners had 21 days to abate the nuisance. She said that she and Chris visited this property today and shared photographs on the TV

with the board. She said that the primary concerns during the visit were the presence of trash and debris near the shed on the far right-hand side of the property. Additionally, there were reports of a fire on the property, which appeared to be a burn pile. Chris added that further investigation revealed potential burn piles on the property with visible discoloration and vegetation damage. He said that they observed a storage shipping container that appears to be in use. Ms. DeWitt asked if there was an odor observed, and Chris said that they could not get close enough to observe an odor. Chris said that the property owners are aware of the concerns and have failed to address them. He said that no action is needed by the board, this is just an update as the matter has been referred to the prosecutor's office for further action. Mr. Bowling started by thanking Zibby and her team for trying to do something about the concerns raised by the community regarding this property. He said that there are reports of dogs, goats, and other animals roaming freely on the property and the presence of these animals has caused significant problems including noise complaints and health concerns. He said that he has been feeding and caring for approximately 50 cats on the property, which has resulted in significant financial burdens. He has reported his concerns to the county and the SPCA, but no further action has been taken. He said that the property owners are aware of the many concerns but fail to take action to resolve them.

New Business

Possible Sewage Nuisance – 840 Victory Road: Zibby said that we received an initial complaint regarding the septic system surfacing onto the neighboring property in June of last year and at that time the property owner hired a septic company to complete the repairs. She said that a few months after the repairs were completed, they noted that sewage was surfacing again. She said that they worked with the property owner, and the soil evaluation was completed in March, however, there has not been any progress towards having the septic system designed or installed. She said that today she received a call from a realtor who is working with the property owners to list the house for sale. The realtor advised that the septic is being pumped monthly until the property sells and part of the listing will note the septic system needs to be replaced. Zibby said that they are asking the board to declare this a public health nuisance due to the sewage surfacing.

Sewage Variance – 413 Bischoff Road: Zibby said that pursuant to the Ohio Administrative Code, it is mandatory for sewage treatment systems to maintain minimum horizontal distance. She said that they conducted an inspection at the 413 Bischoff Road property and found that the ends of the leech lines had been compromised during the excavation process for a new garage. The property owner worked with the

contractor for modifications to the garage construction to ensure compliance, however the required 10-foot separation distance from the septic system was not feasible so the property owner and contractor replaced the garage to 8 feet, thereby minimizing the risk of potential harm to the sewage system. She said that the exposed ends of the leech lines were identified, and it is anticipated that these can be repaired to prevent any potential issues. She said that the sewage system remains unaffected and there was no evidence of sewage surfacing during the inspection. She said that the property owner is requesting a variance to regulations requiring a 10-foot distance from the septic system. She referred to the documents including drawings in the board packet.

Unpaid Aerator Inspection Fees Assessed to Property Taxes: Zibby said that the Ohio Household Sewage Treatment Code requires that all household sewage treatment systems operate under a valid permit and undergo regular inspections to ensure compliance with the code. Some systems, including our discharging aerator systems, require a service contract to maintain mechanical components. In certain cases, older systems (pre-2015) may be exempt from inspections by the health district, however, this exemption does not waive the requirement for property owners to maintain a valid service contract or pay for inspections. She said that as of the end of March, property owners with an affected aerator will receive a letter informing them of the necessary actions. If a property owner fails to respond to the initial letter, a second mailing will be sent, followed by a hand-delivered third notice. She said that unfortunately, approximately 62 properties have not provided a current service contract or paid for inspections, resulting in the outstanding fees. She said that 2 properties initially paid the inspection fee but were late, incurring a late fee that remains unpaid. She said that they are seeking approval to send a letter to the auditor assessing the cost to these properties, which will be added to their property taxes. She added that inspections are still being conducted for approximately 150-200 properties, which requires significant staff time and resources.

Position Upgrades: Chris said that Amanda Cogburn is a WIC Support Clerk 1 and has been with us for more than a year consistently demonstrating excellent performance. He said that her recent evaluations have been favorable, and she has met criteria for the upgrade to WIC Support Clerk 2. Cheyenne said that Randilyn Belford is an LPN 1 and has been an integral part of our team for an extended period of time. Although she held a different role, she has since acquired the necessary qualifications to assume the LPN position and over the past year she has demonstrated exceptional performance in her current capacity. She said that this position upgrade is in line with her professional growth and commitment to delivering high-quality patient care.

Grant Submissions: Gracie said that we have included 3 grant submission requests, all from the Springfield Foundation. She said the first application titled “Start Strong Clark County” seeks funding of \$5,000 to support the retention of Anne Marie, our Infant Vitality Coordinator. She noted that we have received this grant in the same amount over the past 2 years and are cautiously optimistic about being awarded it again. The second application focuses on diabetes education and seeks \$5,000 in funding. She said similarly we have been awarded this grant in the same amount over the past 2 years and are requesting it again. The third application which was submitted last year aims to address solid waste cleanup through environmental health initiatives. She said that despite not receiving funding, we are resubmitting the application to help offset costs. The total requested funding for the 3 applications amounts to \$15,000.

Tobacco & Drug Free Campus Policy Approval: Chris said that this is a revised tobacco and drug-free campus policy that was prompted by a review of our existing policies and discussion about the need for a comprehensive policy that clearly communicates our stance on tobacco and substance use on our campuses. He said that Leah Behler, one of our Health Planners and Gracie, worked together to develop a revised policy and the final product is this 2-page policy that employs modern language and plain communication principles. He said that the policy clearly states that the use of tobacco, nicotine, and any other substances is strictly prohibited on campus, including our buildings, parking areas, and surrounding properties. He noted that in addition to the policy update, we have also prepared tobacco and drug free signage for display at key locations including Home Road and High Street. The signage will clearly declare that tobacco and substance use are prohibited on campus, in accordance with our new policy.

Staffing Changes: Shannon said that Kelly Kitchen who is the Deputy Registrar in our Vital Statistics program and has been with us for 10 years will retire at the end of the month. She said that recently the core team decided to introduce all new staff members during the board meeting following completion of their probationary period and as such she turned the floor to Cheyenne to introduce our newest nursing team member, Kim Wise. Cheyenne said that Kim brings a unique blend of skills and experience to our agency. Kim introduced herself and shared that she holds a master’s degree in public health with a concentration in epidemiology from Kent State University. She said that her professional background includes working as a mental health counselor in schools, primarily in Montgomery County. She said that upon taking time to care for her children, she transitioned into a family business and later returned to the workforce, exploring various roles. Cheyenne added that Kim’s expertise aligns closely with our agency goals, and we are excited to have her as part of our team.

Monthly Fund Report: Jeff reviewed the monthly revenue and expenses as well as the summary budget. He said that he has been working to familiarize himself with the summary budget over the past 5 weeks and has not identified any alarming or critical issues. He said that he has not seen any indication that any funds have been withheld or delayed regarding the allocation of resources but will continue to review the report to ensure that all financial transactions are in compliance with the established guidelines.

PUBLIC HEALTH TEAM REPORTS

Environmental Health: Zibby said that as we approach the opening of the Clark Couty Fair, the environmental health specialist will be conduction thorough inspections of all 60 food facilities within the fairgrounds. She said that these inspections ensure compliance with food safety regulations for a safe and enjoyable experience for all attendees. Their primary focus during the fair will be on verifying that all food establishments adhere to the latest food safety standards, which is essential in preventing the spread of illness and protecting the public’s health. She said that they will offer insect repellents, including insect wipes at our booth allowing attendees to take necessary precautions against mosquito bites. She also reminded everyone to take measures to protect themselves from tick bites, especially considering the presence of the blacklegged tick in Clark County, which can transmit Lyme disease.

Nursing and Clinics: Cheyenne referred to the communicable disease report included in the board packet and said that she would be happy to answer questions about the report. She noted that the severity of our flu season this year, which was a challenging period, with an unusual spike in cases late in the season. She highlighted some of their recent activities including the event they partnered with local organizations to offer free syphilis and HIV testing, which was a huge success. She said that 2 of our nurses, Doug Wyandt and Tara Wagner played a crucial role in promoting this initiative and thanked them for their efforts. She said that our education team lead by Linda Sauers and Pat Bray has been working tirelessly to educate the community on diabetes. She said that their recent workshop was attended by 12 individuals, and all completed a substantial portion of the required sessions. She said that 2 members of our team are currently in Anaheim California attending a conference and have been sharing updates on their experiences.

Early Childhood: Lori shared photos of a family event they recently hosted. She said that the event took place at the WIC building and included various activities in the conference room and outdoors. Their goal was to provide a safe and engaging environment for young families with infants and toddlers. She said that they were fortunate to receive funding support from the Young Women’s Mission, which enabled

them to provide some essential resources, including door prizes and food. She said that unfortunately, they did not reach their desired attendance numbers, with only 20 families joining. She said that they have continuing their collaboration with the Kiwanis organization which has been instrumental in supporting their initiatives and last year donated materials for our 4-H club's "Tummy Time Blanket" project, which has been a valuable resource for the community. She said that we are grateful for their continued support and look forward to future collaborations.

Women, Infants & Children: Chris highlighted our WIC partnership with the hospital on the report which has been a great partnership that allows our Certifying Health Professionals to conduct bedside certifications at the hospital. He said that they have been consistently meeting their certification standards, both for new and recertified patients. He thanked Elise Brown and the Mercy team for their collaboration and support in this initiative. He said that another aspect that caught his attention is the analysis of their caseload numbers for May and June. He noted the increase in the number of cases reported, particularly in comparison to previous months. He said that we have not been operating in New Carlisle, and any changes in our numbers are likely a direct result of the increased demand in Springfield. He said that in an effort to address the convenience issue for participants in New Carlisle, we have incentivized them to visit our office in Springfield by offering diapers for their first few visits. He shared that this incentive has been effective in ensuring that participants still receive the necessary services. Lastly, he said that the farmer's market vouchers, although lower than last year's amount, are still being distributed. He said that the WIC team is working to expedite the vouchers and hope to provide them to eligible participants within the next week, allowing them to take advantage of our farmers markets and access fresh produce.

Health Planning: Gracie said that our health planning team operates our booths at the fair in the mercantile building which does include a breastfeeding booth. She said that there have been recent updates in the tobacco program. In June, they collaborated with the Clark County Sheriff's Department to conduct compliance check on tobacco retailers outside the city limits which led to the discovery of 3 stores selling to underage purchasers, prompting education and reminders to retailers about the T21 law. She noted that there was a delay in obtaining the grant award for the new tobacco program which was set to start in July due to state budget issues, however, we were eventually awarded the grant with a total of \$122,000 allocated, falling short of the initially applied for \$130,000. Lastly, she shared that in partnership with the Clark County Library we officially launched the Bike Share program which aims to promote exercise and active living. She said that as of now, 30 people have checked out bikes in less than a month, and all bikes are being returned.

No Special Report

Legislative Update & Health Commissioner's Comments: Chris first pointed out the revamped vital statistics report, thanks to Shannon, that provides valuable insights into vital statistics, including death and birth summaries. These reports are designed to be informative and facilitate discussions about community trends and concerns, such as birth rates and mortality rates in Clark County.

He next talked about a new transportation solution in Springfield, known as "Field Trips". This initiative has replaced the SCAT bus system and aims to provide an efficient and cost-effective alternative. He said that as of now, the service is available for a limited period, with a two-week overlap between the old and new systems. After that, the Field Trip vehicles will take over, and the existing bus system will be phased out. He said that the service is currently free for two weeks, allowing individuals to experience it firsthand.

Mr. Adamson asked if the vehicles are wheelchair accessible and Chris confirmed that they have 6 or 7 vehicles that are wheelchair accessible and compliant with ADA standards. Dr. Moore asked what hours the service is available. Chris said that the initial phase of the Field Trip service will operate from Monday to Friday, with a limited schedule. He said that the service intends to explore the possibility of extending hours, including evening and weekend services, in the future. Mr. Griffith said that as a member of the committee that studied this initiative, he can attest that it is a novel approach, patterned after a successful project in North Carolina. The primary goal is to provide a more efficient and cost-effective transportation solution to benefit the community. He said that this concept could also be a valuable tool for employers to provide their employees with safe and affordable transportation options.

Moving on to legislative updates Chris said that the budget reconciliation bill has been passed, which includes provisions that have garnered significant attention. He said that the AOHC has analyzed the bill, and its implications are being closely monitored. The bill's effects on various programs, including healthcare and nutrition programs, Medicaid, and SNAP benefits are being scrutinized. He said that the CBO's estimate suggests that the bill will increase the federal deficit by \$3.4 trillion over the next decade, while millions of people will lose their health insurance coverage, and there are concerns about the new work requirements for able-bodied adults leading to increased healthcare costs. He said that Governor DeWine has signed the budget bill, which includes 67-line-item vetoes. He said that some of these vetoes have implications for environmental health and public health, while others may be subject to override votes. He said that the budget bill has far-reaching implications for the community and that he will continue to provide updates as information becomes available.

- In some circumstances, a non-CCCHD employee, contractor, or community partner may be authorized to drive a Health District vehicle. This policy is to ensure that non-CCCHD employees, contractors, and community partners driving a Health District-owned vehicle do so safely and responsibly while complying with legal requirements and minimizing liability to CCCHD.

POLICY & PROCEDURE

- Non-CCCHD employees, contractors, or community partners authorized to operate a Health District vehicle must provide the following:
 - A clear copy of their driver's license
 - Information to verify the license and driver's record, including:
 - Current residential address
 - The last four digits of Social Security Number (SSN)
- Seat belts must be worn by the driver and all passengers at all times
- Drivers must follow all applicable traffic laws and practice safe, defensive driving
- The use of cell phones or handheld electronic devices while operating the vehicle is strictly prohibited
- The driver is fully responsible for the vehicle during the period of use
- Any accidents, traffic violations, vehicle damage, or operational issues must be reported to the Health District immediately. To the extent possible, the non-CCCHD employee, contractor, or community partner will be responsible for vehicle damage if the driver is found to be at fault.















Drug Overdose Prevention

- **One2One**

- Second Harvest Food Bank (SHFB) Partnership: over the month of July, we provided food to 268 clients.
- Sheltered Inc. Partnership: over the month of July, we completed 0 housing referrals.
- Department of Job and Family Services Clark County Partnership: over the month of July, we assisted 3 clients in completing applications for Medicaid and SNAP benefits.
- Harm Reduction Program stats from May 2025 (this data is always 1 month behind): **June stats were not available at the time of this report.**
 - Client Visits: 310
 - Syringes Exchanged: 11,959
 - Narcan Kits Distributed: 85
 - Treatment Referrals: 3

- **Substance Abuse/DOP**

- Program staff continue to support the health navigators that have been placed in Montgomery, Butler, and Greene Counties.
 - The stats from the navigators include:
 - 445 Unique Interactions
 - 1,300 Doses of Naloxone Distributed
 - 1,941 Fentanyl Test Strips Distributed
 - 315 Referrals to Services
- The GROW (Get Recovery Options Working) team is continuing to distribute materials into the community. Through July we have done the following:
 - Visited 147 Addresses
 - Distributed 127 Bags of Information
 - Passed out 60 Boxes of Naloxone
- Program staff are currently partnering with the department of public safety to bring an Operation BRIDGE Day to Clark County.
 - Operation BRIDGE is an initiative that brings public health and public safety together to provide connection to services while public safety works to get substances off the street.



- The Operation BRIDGE event will be taking place at the end of August on the 28th and 29th. At this event individuals will get to meet with treatment providers among many other community partners. 18 vendors are currently signed up and are looking to add more.

Adolescent Health

- The program has continued to develop relationships with youth serving organizations and other community stakeholders to serve on the grant's advisory committee.
- Program staff has continued to schedule trauma informed care training with local youth serving organizations.

Safe Communities

- Over the past month program staff have participated in several community events to increase community awareness of the dangers of distracted driving and seat belt usage for both teens and adults.
- Staff attended National Night Out events in both Springfield and New Carlisle.
- The Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over kick-off will be held on August 22nd. A press conference will be held to highlight the dangers of driving under the influence. Representatives from Springfield Police Department, Clark County Sheriff's Office, and Ohio Highway Patrol will be in attendance.



Motorcycle Ohio

- There are three classes left for 2025. YTD stats include:
 - 180 students
 - 80.45% passing rate

Tobacco

- Throughout the past month, program staff have continued to foster new partnerships throughout the community.
- Program staff have continued to advocate and plan for Tobacco retailer license policy enhancements.
- Program staff is working in collaboration with the Mercy Health Cancer Center to plan outreach activities promoting lung cancer screenings and tobacco education/cessation resources.

Creating Healthy Communities

- CHC continues to be an active member of several local coalitions and taskforces, such as the Clark County Local Foods Council and the Chronic Disease Taskforce.
 - The cardiovascular workgroup has planned 4 HeartStrong events for 2025. The locations will be: CCPL, USS, Groceryland and the YMCA.
- CCPL Bike Share Program –Currently have had 75 bike share users, 52 repeat users. The program is off to a great start!
- Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) Program – Visioning Garden has begun to harvest and have set up relationships with a few new partners, namely: Project Woman's shelter, Pregnancy Resource Center, the WIC office, and two neighborhood pantries (Rock of Hope and Clifton Ave. Church of God). They've started to build a distribution network particularly targeting new/expecting moms in alliance with the Start Strong Coalition addressing infant mortality.
